Mission Statement: Nuclear disarmament should serve as the leading edge of a global trend towards demilitarization and redirection of resources to meet human needs and restore the environment.

The Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) was one of the three most important treaties of the 20th century. In exchange for non-nuclear nations promising not to become nuclear powers, the nuclear weapons states, led by the U.S., pledged to negotiate the complete elimination of their nuclear arsenals. Forty years later the nuclear powers have more genocidal nuclear weapons than they did when the treaty was signed. This double standard and terrorizing threats to initiate nuclear war made by the U.S. and other nuclear weapons states increase the dangers of nuclear war and of nuclear weapons proliferation. The NPT Review Conference, held every five years, provides an opportunity for the world's nations to hold the nuclear powers accountable to their abolition commitment. Along with the vast majority of the world's people:

We call for the nuclear powers to begin negotiating a nuclear weapons abolition treaty without further delay. We also call for the world's powers to start negotiating demilitarization and to spend resources saved to meet the needs of people and the environment.
